

He has facilitated a number of quality assurance trainings in universities in Uganda and in the East African region. Having been trained in Quality Assurance in Europe and in East Africa and is active Quality Assurance Practitioner in his institution, country and this region, he has acquired a wealth of experience in Quality Assurance in Higher Education.



Prof. Mike Kuria

Prof. Mike Kuria is an educationist and the Deputy Executive Director of the Inter University Council for East Africa (IUCEA), holds a Ph.D in Literature from the University of Leeds.
